CENTRAL REGION and TAURANGA BMX CLUB is proud to present the 2019 BMX New Zealand North Island Titles, the premier North Island event for BMX racing in New Zealand. The following guidelines will detail the event and all the requirements for entry.

ENTRIES CLOSE:

ALL CLASSES close 8 pm - 15 September 2019. ONLINE ENTRY ONLY.
Late Entry until 8pm - 22 September 2019. ONLINE ENTRY ONLY.

ALL classes via **ONLINE ENTRY ONLY**

No entry will be taken on day of event.

Entry is complete only when payment is confirmed.

BMXNZ reserves the right to refuse entry to any person.

No refunds will be given after Friday 25 October 2019 for any reason. Any refunds prior to this will only be given on receipt of medical certificate, less an administration fee of \$20.

AUSTRALIAN ENTRIES:

Riders must hold a valid BMXA licence and have adequate racing insurance cover, then apply for a free BMXNZ licence online at www.bmxnz.co.nz > EVENTS > International Licences.

Entry and Payment via std online system with your BMXNZ licence number.

Mighty 11 Open Class:

This is an 'age on the day' class, available to all male and female 20" riders aged 11 years on 20 October 2019. To enter this class, riders must also enter and compete in a challenge class, cruiser class or be a member of the Mighty 11 test teams.

TRANSPONDERS:

Transponders will be used in conjunction with finish line camera system for all riders except participation classes. Please update your Online Profile with your transponder number BEFORE the entries close - <https://nzbm.xclub/riderportal>

Transponder check: It is the rider's responsibility to have the correct transponder fixed to their bike and ensure subscription is current. Riders failing to have a working transponder affixed will be deemed as did not finish (DNF). If a rider's transponder fails during a race, a best effort will be made to correctly place the rider. If determination is not possible, the rider will receive last place. All transponders will need to be checked onsite prior to racing. This will be done at the check point near the Admin hut. The process is a simple roll over a mat loop and then checking details on a screen. Any errors must be noted with event admin ASAP. This process can be done after 3pm Friday until end of practice, Saturday and Sunday from 07.00 until the first moto of the day.

There will be NO rental transponders from BMXNZ



NUMBER PLATES:

Number plates will be issued to riders by the Club Team Manager to all riders and must be used within this event, including all official practice sessions.

Ranking Plates - A rider holding a 1 – 8 ranking from the following meetings; Worlds 2019: W1-8, Oceania 2019: O1-8, BMX NZ National Championships 2019: NZ 1-8, North Island Titles 2018: NI 1-8, 2018 top 3 NZ National Series: NS 1-3 and wish to use this number at the meeting, the ranking must be clearly marked on the entry form. Non-Ranked Plates: Riders may select any number between 51 and 999. If a number is not self selected, a random number will be issued. All riders not selecting a number or with an incorrect ranking will be issued with randomly selected numbers.

RACING FORMAT

MOTO DRAW:

BMX NZ computer moto mixing and lane draws
Quarter and Semi Finals – snake seeding method

LANE DRAW SELECTION:

Quarters, Semis and Main Finals Only. Order of lane choice based on count back to moto points or previous final.

MINIMUM CLASS SIZE

6 riders constitute a class (amalgamations as required). Class sizes will be determined after the close of entries for trophy allocation purposes.

CHALLENGE 20", CRUISER and CHAMPIONSHIP Classes:

4 motos Saturday, 2 motos Sunday then finals (depending on class sizes)

8 or less riders:	4 motos Saturday, 3 motos Sunday, points aggregated
9 or more riders:	4 motos Saturday, 2 motos Sunday then;
9-16 riders:	to deadman final
17-32 riders:	to deadman semis and deadman final
33-64 riders:	to quarters, semis and final (all deadman)
65-80 riders:	to eighths, quarters, semis and final (all deadman)

MIGHTY 11 JUNIOR TEST TEAMS (New Zealand and Australia)

NOTE: All Mighty 11s riders are required to enter their Age Class or the Mighty 11 Class as applicable, in addition to the Test Team classes.

Saturday:	3 motos, beginning of rounds 2, 3, 4
Sunday:	2 motos, beginning of round 5 and end of round 6
Points:	10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 (All points added. Team gate allocation)

MIGHTY 11 OPEN CLASS:

Mixed gender motos. Race format as per M11 MOU

Saturday:	4 motos
Sunday:	2 motos 8 or less riders - 7 motos points over 9-16 riders - motos then top 8 riders to a final. 17-19 riders - motos then 6man semis, top 8 rider to a final. 20+ riders—Motos then 8man semis, top 8 to a final.

KIWI SPROCKETS:

Riders 7yrs will ride in UCI age classes for this event. Standard racing formats apply.
Riders 6yrs and under will be non-ranking participation classes

TIED POSITIONS:

All tied positions will be separated by countback on placings. No run-offs will be held.



CONTINGENCY PLANS:

In case of disruption or weather, moto format may be changed, at the discretion of the Chief Commissaire.

PRIZE GIVING:

This will be held trackside Sunday 27 October, approximately 30 minutes after the finish of racing.

AWARDS AND TROPHY ALLOCATION:

Determined from the time that entries close for Trophy purposes.

For trophy placings, a count back method will be used to rank riders on equal points at the end of racing

Challenge and Championship Class

Classes with 7 riders or less: Trophies and Presentation Plates to 3rd place

Classes with 8-9 riders: Trophies 3rd place and Presentation Plates to 7th place

Classes with 10+ riders: Trophies to 3rd place and Presentation Plates to 8th place

Personalised certificates will be sent to clubs as soon as available.

Mighty 11s Class

Trophies to 3rd place irrespective of gender,

Presentation Plates to finalists in finishing order irrespective of gender

Sprockets

6 and under - all riders will receive an event award

BMXNZ EVENT HEALTH and SAFETY STATEMENT

In the event of injury to an event participant, a completed entry is consent to proper medical treatment being administered. Event entry also consents to submit to drug testing if required. All entrants agree to be bound by the regulations and general conditions for this event as published by BMXNZ in its latest rule book. Any reference to BMXNZ within this flyer or entry is referring to BMX New Zealand Inc.

Safety and safe practices at all BMXNZ calendared events are not negotiable and failure by anyone to comply by the code of conduct or rules of the sport will result in the removal of such person from the event facility.
